# Now coverage is within your reach

The Child Health Program (CHP) / Community Health Care Program (CHCP) is for children and young adults who can't get any other health coverage. And you don't have to be a U.S. citizen to be eligible.

## CHP / CHCP members will get the Kaiser Permanente Platinum 90 HMO plan



You won't pay monthly premiums.



You'll pay low or no costs for most covered services at Kaiser Permanente facilities.

## Do I qualify?

### You're eligible for CHP / CHCP if:

- You live in a Kaiser Permanente service area that is open to new enrollment and:
  - Are 18 or younger
  - Are 25 or younger and live in Fresno, Kings, or Madera counties
- Your household income is no more than 3 times the federal poverty level (for example, up to \$40,770 for a single person or \$83,250 for a family of 4 in 2022).
- You don't have access to any other health coverage, including Medi-Cal, Medicare, a job-based health plan, or coverage through Covered California.

### You may be eligible for Medi-Cal if:

- You're younger than 19 with a total household income at or below 266% of the federal poverty level (for example, \$73,815 for a family of 4 in 2022).
- You're 19-25 or 50 or older with a total household income at or below 138% of the federal poverty level (for example, \$18,755 for a single person in 2022).

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**Please note:** Many children, young adults 25 or younger, and those 50 or older – including noncitizens – now qualify for Medi-Cal. Those who qualify for Medi-Cal are not eligible for CHP / CHCP.



## What happens if my situation changes?

If you become a member, we'll check in with you periodically to see if you still meet the CHP / CHCP requirements. If you're no longer eligible, we'll notify you and you'll be disenrolled from the program. After that, you'll have to pay the regular monthly premiums for the Kaiser Permanente Platinum 90 HMO plan, as well as any out-of-pocket costs – unless you ask us to cancel your membership.

# A healthy future starts here

The Child Health Program / Community Health Care Program provides a subsidy to help pay your monthly premiums and most out-of-pocket medical costs for children and young adults.

## Your costs for care

Here's an example of what you'd pay out of pocket for covered services at a Kaiser Permanente facility when you're enrolled in the Child Health Program / Community Health Care Program.

## Convenient ways to get what you need



### Video or phone appointments

Schedule a face-to-face video visit or phone appointment with a Kaiser Permanente clinician.<sup>3</sup>



### In-person care

We offer same-day, next-day, after-hours, and weekend services at many of our locations.<sup>5</sup>



### Kaiser Permanente app

Manage your health 24/7 – schedule appointments, email your doctor's office with nonurgent questions, order most prescription refills, see most test results, read your doctor's notes, and more.<sup>4</sup>



### Mental health services

Get support for a wide range of conditions, like anxiety and depression, for \$0 out of pocket for most covered services at Kaiser Permanente facilities.

To use the Kaiser Permanente app, you must be a member registered on [kp.org](https://kp.org). For parents using online features for a child, online access is modified when a child turns age 12 due to state privacy laws. 5. In the case of a pandemic, some facilities may be closed or offer limited hours and services. 6. If you're covered by CHP / CHCP, the copays listed in the SBC won't apply for most care at Kaiser Permanente facilities.

# Enrolling in the Child Health Program / Community Health Care Program

## How to apply

### Fill out these documents:

- Application for subsidy
- Application for Health Coverage

Include proof of income and any other required documents listed in the forms above.

## Apply during open enrollment

In most cases, you have to apply for CHP / CHCP during the open enrollment period, which runs from November 1, 2022, through January 31, 2023.

We must receive your completed paperwork by:	To start coverage on:
<b>December 15, 2022</b>	January 1, 2023
<b>January 31, 2023</b>	February 1, 2023

## Apply during a special enrollment period

You can apply for coverage outside the yearly open enrollment period if you have a certain type of event in your life – called a qualifying life event. A qualifying life event is when something important in your life changes. For example, if you get married or divorced, give birth, or lose health coverage because you lost your job, you can apply for coverage through CHP / CHCP.

In general, the special enrollment period lasts 60 days after a qualifying life event.

If you have a qualifying life event, you'll need to send us proof of your qualifying life event, along with your application for subsidy, Application for Health Coverage, and proof of income.
